




transformed into an original melody with the help of Unspoken Symphony. Approximately 200 joined us for our Art Exhibit and Open



Expanding OU Vehicle Fleet

We recently purchased a new 15-passenger van with a lift for one of our residential homes. This beauty was a welcome

Two additional mini vans have been added to our fleet with a grant recently awarded to our organization. These vehicle upgrades have certainly made a difference to the organization and the services provided in the community.



Employment Services



Employment Services is one of the programs within our Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS)
Department. Through our extended partnerships with Life Academy and Iowa Vocational Rehabilitation Services (IVRS), OU's Job Coaches provide a number of services to help those with special needs find meaningful community employment. In addition to helping develop skills needed



for employment, members of this team also help in leading employment assessments, identifying employment opportunities, and job coaching on-site. The goal of HCBS programs is to have individuals living and working in the community; it's been exciting to see these programs develop and expand while supporting our mission, "Maximizing Personal Potential Through Dignified and Purposeful Living."
