Our Residential programs have continued with service delivery in the homes, with our creative direct support professionals working together to keep persons served engaged and active. While some of the Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) begin to pick up, they are still offered on a limited basis and with caution. The Siouxland community has been tremendous at supporting our organization – through gift cards and

cash donations for staff members as well as help with PPE, face masks, and other needed items.

iPads were purchased for each of our homes to help aid in communication with loved ones as well as the opportunity to engage with their peers in different games and





Opportunities Unlimited supports a number of individuals through the various Residential and Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) programs. OU provided services to over 200 individuals in 2020, the breakdown for those served in each program is as follows:

32 Individuals in the ICF/ID Program
7 individuals in the CNRS Program
8 individuals in the HCBS Homes Program
72 individuals in the HCBS Program
28 individuals in the Day Habilitation Program
65 individuals in the Employment Services Program
